The Committee considered an Ordinance offered by Wayne Matewsky, as President: An Ordinance resolving discrepancies between two recently passed Ordinances regarding construction noise.

City Solicitor Colleen Mejia and City Clerk Consultant David Flood were also present.

Mr. Flood provided the Committee with a brief history overview of the ordinances under Sections 12-2002 and 13A-62.0 relating to construction noise and timeframes and his attempt to bring the two in compliance with one another by offering amendments to Section 12-2002(c) (6), Section 13A-62.0(g)(14)b.6 and adding a new Section 13A-62.0(g)(14)b.7. He noted that in Section 13A-62.0 subsection 6 dealt with construction work in residential districts while subsection 7 dealt with construction work in non-residential districts. Solicitor Mejia informed the Committee that proposed amendments were legally sound. Councilor DiFlorio expressed concern over emergency work not being allowed in residential district after the required timeframes and Solicitor Mejia assured the Committee that there was an emergency provision already provided in the current ordinance that would allow such work to occur. The Committee recommended further time to determine if there would be any amendments proposed by Councilor Martin on her agenda item #7 that could impact this Ordinance.

The Committee voted: to grant further time and to refer to the City Solicitor and City Clerk Consultant to determine if any modifications would be necessary in conjunction with item #7.
