The meeting convened at 6:00 P.M.

- Development of the St. Therese pocket park continues. The Chairman has received an update regarding the number of bricks sold. One hundred twelve bricks were originally allotted for sale at \$100 per brick. Sixty-four bricks have been sold, more than half, and sales have now closed.
- Regarding potential grants to finance the historical plaques, Mrs. Ells mentioned the Everett Cultural Council Grant as a possibility. We would apply for this grant in Fall, 2022. In addition, the Chairman will speak with Matthew LaTanzi, head of City Operations, regarding the price of a plaque now standing at Day Park. This plaque may be the kind we want, so we'll need to know the cost of one plaque and apply for a grant that will secure us a total of five.
- Commission members unanimously decided not to work on developing a booklet about Everett's history. We may revisit this issue in the future.
- Old Business – None
- New Business – Antoinette Pace has resigned from the Historical Commission. We thank her for her service. Also, Mrs. DiPerri has suggested that the Commission investigate the possibility of having the Parlin Library

placed on the National Register. In addition, Commission members voiced their desire of consolidating anyl Everett historical materials in one place.

- Next Meeting – At this time, location of the June, 2022 is undetermined.
