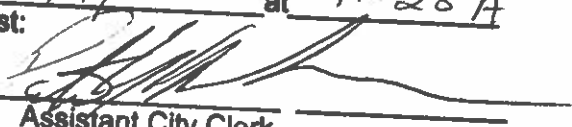

Purpose of Classification Hearing

- MGL Ch. 40 Sec. 56 – Allows a shift in the tax burden between property classes from Residential to Commercial/Industrial/Personal Property
- “The city council together with the mayor’s approval in each city, which has been certified by the Commissioner of Revenue to be assessing property at full and fair cash valuation, shall annually first determine the percentages of the local tax levy to be borne by each class of real property as defined in section 2A of chapter 59 and personal property for the next fiscal year...”
- This does not change the total tax levy for the community; it simply determines the share of the levy to be borne by each class.

What happens after values are Certified by Dept. of Revenue

- Once properties have been classified and certified, the City Council holds a public hearing.
- The Board of Assessors present information to the City Council who then vote whether to establish different rates, **OR** to tax all classes of property at the same rate.

What Happens At the Classification Hearing

- The City Council votes on two different issues:
 1. Selection of the Minimum Residential Factor in order to shift the maximum allowable percentage of the levy onto the commercial, industrial & personal property classes
 2. Adoption of the Residential Exemption

1. Selecting the Minimum Residential Factor

- Approximately 30% of cities and towns have split rates.
- If Everett chooses a single rate, it would be \$15.92 for FY26
- If Everett adopts a split rate at the maximum shift (1.75) this would reduce the tax burden on the residential properties from 76% to 58% of the tax levy and increase the C/I/P share from 24% to 42%

The Four Classes of Property

- Residential
- Commercial
- Industrial
- Personal Property

Levy Limit

- Levy Limit - The Maximum amount the city can levy each year. The levy limit can grow each year by 2.5% of the prior year's levy limit plus new growth and any Proposition 2 ½ overrides. When the City Council signs the LA5 form after the classification hearing they also acknowledge that they have been advised of any excess levy capacity for that fiscal year.
- Maximum Allowable Levy - This is the Levy Limit plus Debt Exclusions or other allowable adjustments.
- Override capacity - The difference between the levy limit and the levy ceiling.

LEVY

- The levy for FY2026 approved budget is \$133,987,765 The FY2025 approved budget levy was \$117,262,518
- Able to raise up to (Levy Limit) \$ 191,551,198
 - Leaves Excess Levy Capacity of \$57,564,433. Again, this year the majority of the increased growth in the tax base was the result of new multifamily construction and various personal property.

2. Vote on the Residential Exemption

Mass. General Laws Ch.59 Sec. 5C allows up to a 35% discount (of the average residential value) to owner occupied residential properties:

Exclusions to this exemption are:

- ❑ Vacant Land
- ❑ Residential properties not occupied as a primary residence by the owner.

Res. Exemption Calculation (Con't)

Total value of Residential Exemptions =

Subtract the Res. Ex. Value from the total Residential Value =
 $7,151,335,781 - 884,918,248 = 6,266,420,353$

Divide the residential levy amount (77,227,457) by the revised residential value = \$ 12.32 Res Tax Rate

Vote

□ Two votes are needed:

1. For a 1.75% shift, a vote for a minimum residential factor of 0.774312 is needed

This would reduce the residential sectors tax burden from 76% of the levy to 58% of the levy and raise the C/I/P sector from 24% to 42 %
