 - a. Request for HP 54 Warren Street
 - b. Request by residents to make Clarence St a one-way
 - c. Request to add “No Parking Any Time Signs” at the entrance of Sacramone Park (Kelvin St @ Wellington Ave)
 - d. Request for 2-sided parking on Francis St (QAlert #512981)
 - e. Request for 2-sided parking on Chatham Rd (QAlert #513038)
 - f. Request that the MBTA Bus Lane and the 15-minute sign (area of 454-498 Ferry St) be adjusted to allow enough space to park in the 15-minute spot (QAlert #514708)
 - g. Complaint that whenever emergency vehicles drive through the intersection of the entrance to the Encore Casino, the sensors pick up the flashing emergency lights and forces a green light for traffic to flow straight through on Broadway, but it entirely neglects to later give the green light for cars on Broadway to turn left into the casino, onto Horizon Way. This leads to traffic building up on Alford Street, trying to drive into Everett and the casino. Emergency vehicles don't always pass through at the same time, so people are left stranded behind a red light for multiple light cycles. Please add a green light for left turns into the casino to alleviate traffic congestion after the traffic lights turn green to make way for emergency vehicles (QAlert #515423)
 - h. Complaints of speeding on Gladstone St (QAlert #513849) Plumer St intersecting Chelsea St (QAlert # 514715) Chelsea St near park (QAlert #514840) Second St intersecting Lewis St (QAlert #512925) Union St (QAlert #514688) Bradford St (QAlert #516599) looking for speed study, speed bumps or slow signs
 - i. Complaint that ever since the city made Nichols St a one-way, the traffic on Harvard St has been bad. Lots of issues with cars speeding. Resident requesting that at the top of Sunnyside Ave, where it connects with Harvard St to make that a three-way stop. (QAlert # 516658)
 - j. Complaint about parking issues at 39 Baker Rd at the Day Care Center (QAlert # 516713)
 - k. Discuss letter (s) of Support for Ride Safe Act (Bill S.3077) (per E Molinari)
 - l. Traffic Commission will approve all speed bumps according to regulations and criteria that will be put in place
 - m. Request to turn taxi stand in Glendale and Everett Squares into parking spaces for Ride Sharing/Uber Eats
 - n. School Buses on residential streets via special parking passes should be on the street where they reside or in municipal lots. (per F Cafasso o-u)
 - o. I would like to call the owner of JC Market before the board in regards to his lack of consideration for the neighborhood via parking and traffic, that also applies to the Bodega and Rumors on Ferry St parking on the Hash tags all hours, it is not the boards responsibility to provide parking.
